Evan W. Terry, Epsilon Phi '93 (*McGill University*) is the 24th president of Psi Upsilon's Executive Council. He took the oath of office at this summer's Convention. Evan is the first Canadian (he has dual citizenship) and the second brother from the Epsilon Phi to hold the office. David A. B. Brown, Epsilon Phi '66, served as Executive Council president from 1994-1998.

Executive Director Tom Fox said: "Evan Terry's professional knowledge and experience together with his enthusiasm for this fraternity will be invaluable as we embark upon a strategic plan in 2016 and build the future of Psi Upsilon."

Past Executive Council president Mark Bauer added: "Evan's keen intellect, exceptional leadership, and love of Psi U made him the logical choice to become president of the Executive Council. But choosing the next leader of Psi Upsilon requires more than just logic; Evan's enduring friendships with alumni and undergraduates, as well as board members and staff, made this choice come straight from our hearts."

Brother Terry holds a degree in economics with a minor in computer science from McGill and an MBA from Columbia University. Evan is a senior consultant/architect in advanced analytics with West Monroe Partners in Chicago. He and his wife, Jen, have two children and live in Evanston, Illinois.

Evan has served on the Executive Council since 1998 and was treasurer of The Psi Upsilon Foundation from 1998 - 2006. Psi U is in his blood; Evan's Psi U lineage includes his great grandfather, great uncle, grandfather, father, two uncles, and his brother.

His first call to action as president is the creation of a strategic plan. This fall, the Executive Council and Foundation directors will come together to chart the course for Psi U's future.

Evan's term of office runs through 2020, an apt year for developing a clear-sighted vision for Psi Upsilon.
