

Nobody Would Ask Me, But:

Last spring, just prior to the end of the academic year at the University Owlie was privileged to attend, he had occasion to take part in a meeting of his Chapter of Psi Upsilon. The meeting was conducted with all the solemnity and decorum of years past. At the close all present formed an unbroken circle, clasped hands as Brothers have done from time immemorial, and raised their voices in "Dear Old Shrine." It was a moment to be remembered. The words still are ringing in my ears.

"We love thee yet, we'll ne'er forget the days of auld lang syne." You remember. Or, if you don't, they may be found in "Songs of the Psi Upsilon Fraternity"—the last phrases of the beautiful refrain which follows each of the three beckoning verses. In those few words may be found the true mysticism which has made Psi Upsilon what

it is. They tie the present with the past. They make us one.

Shifting the scene, Owlie recently had the pleasure of reviewing the record totals of the Annual Giving Program for 1975-76. What a lift to find that so many more of the Brethren than the year before had come forward to give what they could and thereby swell the amount contributed from less than \$37,000 to more than \$50,000! Owlie is not long on statistics, but apparently nearly two hundred rallied to the cause who have never given before, and the honor roll of contributors jumped from under fourteen

hundred Psi U's to over eighteen hundred! This augurs well for the future.

These two seemingly unrelated accounts may appear to be a strange introduction for this editorial. If you will think about it, however, you will realize that there is a very obvious relationship. At some time in the past each of us learned to add our voices to the chorus, "We love thee yet, we'll ne'er forget the days of auld lang syne." It truly can be said that the many who have participated in the Annual Giving Program year after year "love thee yet," Psi Upsilon, have not forgotten, and will "ne'er forget." Now a goodly number of additional voices have joined in the chorus of participation. These, too, love her yet and will not forget. As the third verse of this same hallowed song recites, "linked by a chain" does have real and tangible significance.

At the same time there remain upwards of fifteen thousand Brothers who are not yet aware of this relationship between the Shrine Song and the Annual Giving Program. Owlie recognizes, of course, that life after college is a complex affair, one which exposes our Brothers to many stresses and pressures. It is wholly understandable that so many, while climbing the ladder of life, become so beset with the immediate that they do not find a quiet time in which they can reflect, "Yes, I still love Psi Upsilon."

If every one of us were to remember our vow of love and our vow to remember, the cumulative effect on our beloved Brotherhood would stagger our imaginations. Annual Giving could grow in a short time to a six-figure total. The Fraternity's endowment funds could swell to a sum large enough to insure the continuance of Psi Upsilon as a dynamic force on college campuses for years to come. And a controlled program of expansion could be undertaken which would enable hundreds more each year to become part of an experience which has meant so much to so many.

We are now on the threshold of a new Annual Giving Program—for 1976-77. Once again you will be invited to contribute to the ongoing operations of Psi Upsilon. It will be another opportunity for the non-givers to become givers, for the occasional givers to become regular givers. Owlie suggests that each of us repeat to ourselves the familiar chorus, "We love thee yet, we'll ne'er forget the days of auld lang syne." It could produce a miracle.

Do you, Brother, love Psi Upsilon yet? Will you, Brother, "ne'er forget?" If you do, and if you will, you will find those words ringing in your ears again, as Owlie did at the Chapter meeting in the spring. For it is the same today as when you were there to form an unbroken circle, to clasp the hands of your Brothers, and to sing once more our sacred hymn.

The 133rd Convention a Business and Social Success; The Omicron Chapter Proves to Be a Genial Host

As one hundred and forty-eight loyal alumni, undergraduates, wives, and dates joined in a giant circle with clasped hands at the Round Barn in Champaign, Illinois on Saturday evening, August twenty-eighth, for the traditional singing of "Dear Old Shrine," the 133rd Convention of Psi Upsilon drew to a fitting close. This was the final scene at the Convention Banquet, which climaxed four days of productive meetings and enlivening social activities.

Earlier in the evening the guests had been treated to a magnificent dinner under the supervision of R. Kevin Graham, Omicron '73, able manager of this large and popular eating facility. Robert R. Pfeiffer, Omicron '62 had capably filled the role of toastmaster and had introduced, among others, Guy C. Fraker, III '60, Omicron's Alumni President, and Thomas W. McCaffer, Jr., Omicron '77, Undergraduate President. Robert W. Morey, Pi '20, President of the Executive Council, had presented the trophy for academic distinction in 1975-76 to the Theta Theta Chapter. And E. Willis Brown, Omicron-Mu '31, a noted journalist, had delivered the principal address of the evening, touching nostalgically on our great heritage in Psi Upsilon and the justifiable pride we may take in our fraternal ties.

On Wednesday, the twenty-fourth, undergraduate delegates from twenty-two Chapters had converged on the University of Illinois for three simultaneous Regional Mini-Conferences. These provided a welcome opportunity for members from the same geographical area to become acquainted, compare notes, and share both successes and concerns. Meetings that first day and throughout the balance of the week, as well as dinners and all rooming accommodations, were centered in the twenty-one floor Century Twentyone, a modern hotel just three blocks from the Omicron Chapter House.

The Convention opened formally the next afternoon, with Brother Morey reciting the traditional opening words spoken at all Chapter meetings of the Pi. So ambitious was the agenda considered by the seven standing committees during the succeeding two days that planned workshops for specific areas of responsibility in operating a Chapter gave way to extra committee and general meetings. The atmosphere throughout was one of serious application, determined progress, and constructive spirit.

Among the principal actions taken was the raising of annual Chapter taxes from \$20 to \$25 for each member and an increase of the initial payment from \$20 for a lifetime Diamond subscription to \$30, now to be called an initiation fee and still including \$20 for the Diamond lifetime subscription. Deeply impressed by the extraordinary growth of the Annual Giving Program through more and larger alumni contributions, the undergraduate delegates felt that student members must respond comparably in order to balance the Fraternity's operating budget.

Also enacted was a new provision for honorary members, to be selected from those not otherwise eligible for membership, in recognition of outstanding achievement and devotion to the Fraternity. Honorary members were given the privilege of attending Chapter meetings but are not eligible to serve on the Executive Council or as official Convention delegates. A new official Psi Upsilon necktie was adopted, an Awards Committee added to the Convention standing committees in order to introduce a greater focus on recognition within the Fraternity, and the Nu Alpha Chapter at Washington and Lee University, which closed in 1974, formally and regretfully placed on inactive status.

Greater undergraduate involvement in the affairs of the Fraternity was exemplified by an increase from three to four members in undergraduate representation on the Executive Council. Elected to one-year terms were: Gregory J. Brown, Epsilon Omega '77; Peter S. Crosby, Beta Beta '78; Jeffrey M. Jordan, Pi '78; and Thomas A. Leghorn, Delta '77. Alternate undergraduate members for 1976-77 are: Christopher J. Keefe, Upsilon '77; Stuart O. Roberts, Kappa '77; Lawrence L. Schuyler, Chi Delta '78; and David E. Sorge, Phi '78.

Alumni members re-elected to the Executive Council included: Charles M. Hall, Nu Alpha '71 and Allan B. Wechsler, Epsilon Nu '68 for five-year terms; Robert W. Morey, Pi '20 for two years; and John K. Menzies, Pi '41 for one year. Charles A. Werner, Omega '55 was added for a two-year term. John A. Fogarty, Jr., Tau '56 and Wolcott A. Hokanson, Jr., Kappa '50 had sent their regrets that they would be unable to accept re-election.

A highlight of the Convention was the challenge given by Frederick A. Nichols, Omicron '29 in an address presented after dinner on Thursday. "It's time to rekindle the spirit of Psi Upsilon in those within our ranks," he said in part, "who, by their lack of support, indicate that their affiliation with us ended when they left the college or university campus. . . . You undergraduates must make a determined effort to support this project, as well as pledge your continuing support and interest when you terminate your undergraduate careers . . . I ask that each of you . . . take this message back with you and each of you undergraduates join a crusade to re-establish viable alumni contact. . . ."

Other memorable features were an outstanding presentation of rushing procedures and techniques by three Epsilon Omega undergraduates and an actual initiation ceremony performed by the Omicron Chapter. Delegates attended as observers the summer meeting of the Executive Council on Thursday evening and were treated to a street dance Friday evening, a popular function at the University of Illinois with all the students back on campus for registration. The tapping of beer kegs at the Chapter House every evening typified the convivial hospitality extended by the Omicron throughout the four-day period.

Judging by the delegates and other members who attended the 133rd Convention, all Chapters are to be commended for sustaining the Fraternity's historic standard of selecting for membership young men of character, will, determination, and a keen understanding of what it means to be a Psi U.

A vast amount of credit must be given to the committee chairmen who undertook the sizeable task of providing for the many facets of the Convention. Apart from support by the Alumni Association these young men of the Omicron Chapter did a yeomanlike job with a minimum of problems arising. The Convention Chairman was William P. King, '73. He was assisted by John R. Parker, '28, as Alumni Host. The other work was parcelled out to several specific Chairmanships: Robert S. Petersen, Jr., '68, Finance; Lawrence R. Hatch, '34, Local Arrangements; John

Sports, and Joseph A. Miller, '57, in charge as the House Financial Chairman.

Brother John R. Parker, '28, the Alumni Host, was unable to attend due to illness. Brother Parker has been, for years, a prominent attendant at conventions and as a member of the Executive Council. The members of the Executive Council wished him a speedy recovery.

The Second Psi Upsilon Fellow Takes Over

Early in July Jon I. Buchanan, Omicron '76 assumed the responsibilities of Psi Upsilon Fellow at the Fraternity office in Paoli, Pennsylvania, succeeding Louis S. Menyhert, Delta '75. His one-year appointment as the second recipient of this honor provides a salaried position with junior executive responsibilities for Psi Upsilon.

Hailing from Knoxville, Illinois, where he was senior class president in high school, played varsity football, and graduated in the highest tenth of his class academically, Brother Buchanan majored in business at the University of Illinois. A brother, H. Charles Buchanan, Jr. '65 was president of the Omicron Chapter in his senior year.

At Champaign Jon served variously as corresponding secretary, alumni relations chairman, editor of the alumni newsletter, and kitchen manager of the Omicron Chapter. Elected an undergraduate member of the Executive Council at the 1975 Convention in Syracuse, his close contacts with all Chapters in the West, for which he was responsible, received the hearty commendation of the Fraternity's administrative body. He exercised unusual initiative in developing an active relationship with the two Chapters on the West Coast.

Brother Buchanan's responsibilities this year include acting as liaison officer to undergraduates, planning

Regional Conferences, and participating in Chapter reactivation and expansion, in addition to general staff duties.

The Council is a national public information organization for the jewelry industry whose members are manufacturers and retailers.

Reynolds du Pont, Jr., Pi '69 has moved from Greenville, Delaware to Fishers Island, New York, where he is vice president of Pirates Cove Marina, Inc.

Thomas H. Dyer, Pi '34 has received the Silver Antelope, Scouting's highest award for service to youth at the regional level. Over a fifty-year period he has served as scoutmaster, skipper, commissioner, training chairman, vice president, and president of the Hiawatha Council. A noted attorney, Brother Dyer was toastmaster for the 100th Anniversary Banquet of the Pi Chapter during last year's Psi Upsilon Convention at Syracuse.

Hilbert H. Finn, Pi '50 is district manager for the Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Co. in Pittsfield, Massachusetts. In his spare time he serves as assistant division director for the Eastern Division of the National Ski Patrol System, Inc.

William H. Freeman, Jr., Pi '63 is marketing manager for the commercial line of the Armstrong Cork Company's Carpet Division in Westfield, New Jersey.

George E. Garland, Lambda '76 is secretary in New York City for a United Nations committee of experts from government and education studying the regulation of multinational business. When the report of its recommendations is completed, he will be involved in a project concerned with patterns in international banking.

Before joining ESB in 1964, he was director of public relations for the Philadelphia office of Erwin Wasey, Ruthrauff & Ryan, Inc., an international advertising agency; Chicago district manager of Harry W. Smith, Inc., a New York technical public relations consulting firm; and associate editor of "Iron Age" Magazine in New York City. He is a past chairman of the Public Relations Council of the National Association of Manufacturers.

Thomas H. Wyman, Gamma '51 was elected an alumni trustee of Amherst last spring to succeed John C. Esty, Jr., Gamma '50, whose term had expired. Another of the nominees with Brother Wyman was Miner D. Crary, Jr., Gamma '42, president of the Gamma Chapter Corporation and a partner in the New York law firm of Curtis, Mallet-Prevost, Colt & Mosle. Other Gamma alumni on Amherst's Board of Trustees include George L. Shinn '45, chairman of the board, and Oliver B. Merrill '25, past chairman of the board.

Brother Wyman became president and chief executive officer in 1975 of the Green Giant Company in Chaska, Minnesota, after ten years as senior vice president and general manager of the Polaroid Corporation in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Earlier he had been with the First National City Bank of New York and the Nestlé Co. in White Plains, New York and Vevey, Switzerland. *Time* Magazine selected him in 1974 as one of "200 Rising World Leaders."

W. Thomas Beebe, Mu '37 is chairman of the board of Delta Air Lines, which earned more profits in four of the last six years than the five other biggest airlines combined. While remaining the tightly run, efficient airline it always has been, the Delta's relative position is weakening, Brother Beebe recently stated, due in large part to the Civil Aeronautics Board's policy of protecting weak companies rather than rewarding efficient ones. What to do, he was asked. "We're going to keep running the best, safest, most passenger-conscious airline. And we're going to keep fighting like hell for new routes."

Stuart B. Bolger, Upsilon '43 is director of a living history museum which opened last May in Mumford, New York, depicting life in a Western New York village during the first half of the 19th Century. Conceived by John L. Wehle, Upsilon '40, chairman of the board of the Genesee Brewing Company, the project is about half complete aften ten years and has cost about \$2 million for the purchase, relocation, restoration, and period furnishing of the buildings to date. A blacksmith shop, school, church, and general store are among the thirty buildings presently viewable, with a pottery, sawmill, and gristmill still to be added.

Michael J. Kosoff, Psi '60, now executive vice president of Edward L. Nezelek, Inc., a general contracting firm based in Johnson City, New York, has been elected president of the Syracuse Builders Exchange, representing three hundred and thirty companies in the construction industry. He is also a director of the Building Trades Employers Association of Central New York.

Philip M. Lewis, Psi '63, who formerly taught clinical psychology at the University of Georgia, has been appointed associate professor of psychology at the University of Pittsburgh.

Robert W. Leberman, Pi '54 has accepted a new position as director of development for the University of New Hampshire. For eighteen years he had served on the development staff of Syracuse University, first as director of the annual giving program, and later as vice president for development in charge of annual giving and alumni programs.

John C. Haas, Gamma '40, chairman of the board of the Rohm and Haas Co., was one of eight recipients of this year's Philadelphia Award for outstanding community service. Founded in 1921 by publisher Edward W. Bok, the award this year recognized distinguished service to young people. Brother Haas has served as chairman of the board of the Boys Club of Metropolitan Philadelphia.

William H. Joslin, Jr., Sigma '47 was elected vice president of the General Agents Association of National Life Insurance Company of Vermont last spring, after serving successively as executive committee member, treasurer, and secretary. The firm's general agent in Providence, Rhode Island, he led a general session at the annual meeting in Miami, Florida.

The board of directors of the Chemung Canal Trust Company in Elmira, New York has elected Psi U's to the two highest offices in the bank. William E. Clark, Tau '35 has assumed the newly created position of chairman of the board and chief administrative officer. He has been succeeded as president and chief executive officer by Boyd McDowell, II, Pi '47.

Starting his banking career two years after graduation from the University of Pennsylvania, Brother Clark served successively as assistant secretary, vice president, and senior vice president before becoming president in 1966.

Brother McDowell is a great, great grandson of one of the founders and first president of Chemung Canal Bank. After graduating from Holy Cross College and Cornell Law School, he practiced law for six years before joining the Trust Department of the bank in 1956. He became secretary in 1966, vice president and secretary a year later, and senior vice president and secretary in 1969.





1975-76 Gifts Show Dramatic Increase

Alumni support of Psi Upsilon kept pace handsomely last year with the growing interest in fraternities on campuses north, east, south, and west. The Fraternity's heartfelt appreciation goes out to 1,804 alumni (and undergraduates!) who contributed \$50,195 toward the operating budget. This represents a 30% jump in brothers and a 36% jump in the total raised over the previous year.

Nearly 15% of those who responded, 259 in all, made leadership gifts of \$50 or more, an extraordinary 75% increase in this category. At the same time

many gave an equally welcome \$5 or \$10 to have a share in the ground swell. The average donation rose in 1975-76 from \$26.59 to \$27.78.

Years of continuous support are shown in parentheses after name and class. A surprising number have contributed all 14 years since the start of Annual Giving.
