Nobody Would Ask Me, But:

Over the years Owlie has been privileged to set down on paper many thousands of words, either for publication in the news media or for the judiciary to review in the privacy of their chambers. The former were articles written under pressure to meet deadlines for the morning edition of the local newspaper. The latter, in contrast, were considered affidavits or briefs handed up to the bench to substantiate represented positions with interpretations of the law in specific cases.

It has been many years since Owlie has engaged in the first of these divergent styles of writing and could rightfully call himself "an ink-stained wretch," an epithet so often used to designate those pursuing the journalistic profession. Hence it has been some time since Owlie has been both the recipient of generous accolades from certain readers and the target of outrageous arrows from others.

For the last four years your scribe has been given the opportunity of returning to this earlier calling. It has been his objective to make *The Diamond of Psi Upsilon* more interesting for its readers. In the course of his efforts he has wandered extensively in subject matter, yet always dedicated in one way or another to the betterment of Psi Upsilon. The gamut of his meanderings has ranged far and wide, but consistently endeavoring to move in a constructive direction. These have been carefully weighed excursions into the world of journalism that he knew "way back when."

Unlike the "old days," however, comments from our readers have been few and far between. Those reactions we have received invariably have been on the side of qualified praise. In one instance an alumnus far removed from the fraternity scene was inspired to join the growing army of loyal Psi U alumni who contribute annually of their resources toward the goals and causes of our Fraternity.

In recent column Owlie ventured into a new area of financial support available to our alumni who wish to assure the perpetuation of Psi Upsilon down through the years. It was recognized that many of our brothers may find it difficult to give of their substance during their lifetime, for one reason or another. An alternative was presented of providing for Psi Upsilon after one's departure from this world a gift which could be larger and even more helpful to the Executive Council and the Fraternity at large than an annual contribution. Your writer has been involved in lengthy discussions of this possibility with alumni of his own Chapter. All concur that here, indeed, is a means of assuring the perpetuation of the Chapter as well.

Since proposing that alternative to the great body of Psi U's readership, Owlie has been surprised to have received but one response. It came in the form of an expression of regret by one in this same Chapter that he would be unable to include a sizeable bequest to the Chapter in his Last Will and Testament. The objection stemmed from his wife, who justifiably felt that her husband should provide first for her, in the event she survived him, with the possibility that she might have to face later on the heavy expense of a long illness. Each with whom the alumnus shared his decision agreed with the soundness of his wife's position, but a way out of this impasse was suggested.

Legal beagles in whom the alumnus confided proposed that funds which a donor wished to bequeath to such organizations as his Chapter, the Fraternity, and/or his college or university could be placed in a trust. The income from this trust would be directed to the widow, if she survived her husband, and she should have the right to invade the principal of the trust, if necessary. Upon her demise the trust could be terminated, with the principal distributed to the stipulated beneficiaries in accordance with the original trust agreement.

The purpose of repeating this suggestion of an earlier column that gifts to Psi Upsilon after death be considered by our alumni membership, of course, is to impress this means of aiding the Fraternity upon our readers and to elicit further responses. Here is an ideal way to translate our loyalty into tangible form by augmenting Psi Upsilon's limited endowment funds. Owlie truly hopes that many will take this suggestion to heart and initiate steps toward its realization.

One of the Best Conventions Ever

The 134th Hailed as Great Success

Not long after the Convention Banquet marked the closing moments of the 134th Convention of Psi Upsilon, the accolades began pouring in. Comments from delegates and from other alumni and undergraduates who attended, as well as from the many wives on hand, praised the Delta Chapter, which had served as host for this annual gathering. New York University at Washington Square in New York City provided what was termed an incomparable setting for the occasion, held from August 23 through 26.

Certain specific features can be pinpointed as contributing to the Convention's outstanding success. For the first time in years all of the Fraternity's twenty-five active Chapters were represented by undergraduate delegates. In a few instances, where distance was a factor, one active member made the long trek to the "Big Apple." The majority of Chapters sent two undergraduates. And there were nine whose two official student delegates were supplemented by one, two, or three interested undergraduate participants.

A second key feature was the varied and thorough scheduling of events by the Delta's Convention Committee, headed by Joseph G. Marra '53 as General Chairman, with Sanford N. Scharf '78 as Undergraduate Chairman, and David W. Harold '74, Andrew M. Kerstein '76, Thomas A. Leghorn '77, and Louis S. Menyhart '75 as Co-Chairmen. Careful planning had been underway since January, and no detail had been overlooked.

Still another factor drawing acclaim was the excellence of the facilities. All official delegates and others were housed in the Weinstein Center for Student Living, a coeducational dormitory complete with air conditioning and a private bath for each room. The Sisters of the Delta, organized as Alpha Delta Psi, took care of

the alumni rooms each day, in addition to many other housekeeping functions they performed cheerfully and capably. General meetings and committee meetings were held in the modern and well-appointed Loeb Student Center. Virtually every Delta undergraduate had returned to N.Y.U. early to have everything in readiness, and there were committees to maintain the meeting rooms and to furnish the coffee and Coke breaks, all right on schedule.

The Ben Snow Room, high up in the magnificent Elmer Holmes Bobst Library, was the scene of three banquet-style luncheons, each with appropriate speaking programs, the Thursday affair being sponsored by the New York Metropolitan Association. Only the Convention Banquet was held "off campus," at the Fifth Avenue Hotel, four blocks north of Washington Square, the nearest facility large enough to accommodate the burgeoning attendance on the final evening.

No review of the Convention setting would be complete without mention of the Delta Chapter's new home, where the summer meeting of the Executive Council took place on Wednesday evening and where all breakfasts were served, Continental style, as well as two buffet dinners. Again it was the Delta undergraduates and their sister counterparts who managed the preparation and the handling of the meals. Throughout the summer the Delta contingent had labored diligently and proudly to ready the House to be shown off, and the glowing reactions must have made it all seem worthwhile. The adjacent patio, center of beer taps each evening, provided an extra touch of welcome hospitality.

This seventh Convention hosted by the Delta coincided with the 140th anniversary of the founding of Psi Upsilon's first "branch." In actuality the "new" Chapter House is older than the Delta itself, dat-

ing back to the early days of New York City. Its location is but sixty feet from the actual center of the farm owned by Alexander Hamilton, first Secretary of the Treasury. In later years the house was to be celebrated as the residence of Edgar Allen Poe, author of "The Raven."

A unique event on the four-day program was a three-hour boat trip around Manhattan on Thursday afternoon. Transported by chartered buses to Pier 83 at the foot of West 43rd Street, the Conventioneers boarded the Circle Line dayliner for a memorable cruise under a clear blue sky on a hot summer day with a gentle breeze blowing. Starting down the Hudson River and rounding the Statute of Liberty, the sightseers made their way up the East River to the Harlem River and back to the Hudson. In addition to the remarkable panoramic view of Manhattan Island afforded by the circling tour, each of the other boroughs of Greater New York—Staten Island, Brooklyn, Queens, and the Bronx—came into sight, punctuated by historical and humorous comments from our informative guide.

Other tours were arranged for wives of alumni attending the Convention, and they were invited as well to be present at all proceedings and functions. Under the able leadership of Mrs. J. Russell McShane and Mrs. Joseph G. Marra, the ladies were escorted on a one-hour walking tour of Greenwich Village one day and a visit to the Frick Collection and the Guggenheim Museum on another.

As has become the custom over the past four years, the formal Convention was preceded by Regional Mini-Conferences on the opening evening and first morning. Following registration and a chance to become acquainted during dinner at one of Greenwich Village's noted Italian restaurants, the undergraduate delegates met at the Delta Chapter House in joint session Tuesday evening for orientation

purposes and to start focusing on the experiences and concerns of their respective Chapters which they might share with others the next day. Separate meetings of the New England, the Upper New York State, the Southeastern, and the Western Chapters simultaneously Wednesday morning provided an opportunity to do so.

Prior to the formal opening of the Convention on Wednesday afternoon, William Payne, Vice President of New York University, extended greetings from the University during the luncheon. Serving also as the faculty advisor to the Delta Chapter, his remarks were particularly appropriate, as he urged all present to acquaint themselves during their short sojourn with their host institution, which is recognized to be the largest metropolitan university of any city in the country.

Wednesday afternoon, Thursday morning, Friday morning, and Friday afternoon were given over to business sessions, general meetings alternating with committee meetings. One stimulating innovation is worthy of note. An undergraduate delegate from each Chapter was called upon at some time during one of the general meetings to select and describe what he felt to be the most significant highlight attributable to his Chapter in 1976-77. Responses ranged from diversification of membership to brotherhood, to pledge education, to alumni relations, to a return to traditions, to community service.

Conventions serve as the primary source of legislation governing the Fraternity, it must be remembered. Included in resolutions enacted this year were the following:

(1) The term of the Psi Upsilon Fellow's appointment to be extended from twelve to thirteen months, starting July 1, for the purpose of indoctrinating his successor, with the option available to the Executive Council of renewing his appointment for a second year. *Ed. note: That option subsequently has been exercised by the Executive Council, and Michael L. Huffman, Zeta '77 has accepted a second year appointment.*

(2) The title of the Psi Upsilon Fellow to be changed to Field Director, in order to identify more accurately the function of the position and to emphasize its importance in the Fraternity structure.

(3) A final budget for the fiscal year 1977-78 approved of \$104,090 in receipts and \$109,625 in disbursements for a net deficit of \$5,535. Reductions in salaries by curtailing the position of recording secretary from full time to half time and in postage were approved, but the elimination of an IBM memory typewriter purchase and a reduction in travel allowance

were rejected. It was hoped that the collection of past due Chapter assessments would offset the projected deficit.

(4) The Gamma Tau Chapter at the Georgia Institute of Technology to receive the Psi Upsilon Award for Academic Distinction for 1976-77.

(5) George A. Faricy, Omicron '29 to receive the first Robert W. Morey, Pi '20 Song Award, established by the 133rd Convention, for the seven new Psi Upsilon songs whose words and music he had written for this occasion. Throughout the Convention Brother Faricy was on hand to lead informal groups at the piano in singing these popular additions to the Fraternity's rich treasury of songs.

(6) William McPherson, IV, Phi '34 and Edward S. Fries, Eta '45 elected Honorary Life Members of the Executive Council; Henry B. Poor, Gamma '39 and Richard D. Sherwood, Upsilon '56 re-elected Members of the Executive Council for five-year terms; John K. Menzies, Pi '41 and John W. White, Jr., Chi '28 re-elected for 1-year terms; and Keith M. Callow, Theta Theta '49 elected for a three-year term.

(7) Jack P. Kramer, Gamma '79; Neal R. Miller, Upsilon '78; Lawrence L. Schuyler, Chi Delta '78; and Paul D. Stoddart, Mu '79 elected Undergraduate Members of the Executive Council for one-year terms; and Douglas J. Brenner, Pi '79; Kelvin G. Charvet, Omega-Theta Theta '78; R. Nichols Scheu, Zeta '78; and John E. Schneider, Eta '78 elected Alternate Undergraduate Members for one-year terms.

(8) The Xi Chapter at Wesleyan University to host the 135th Convention in 1978 at Middletown, Connecticut on the occasion of the 135th anniversary of the founding of the Xi Chapter.

Climaxing the Convention on Friday evening was the closing banquet, effectively presided over by Carl A. Beck, Delta '41, a skilled toastmaster. An unscheduled and unanticipated feature long to be remembered was initiated by Michael L. Huffman, Zeta '77, newly named Field Director. In turn he asked all representatives of each Chapter to stand and offer a rendition of something indigenous to their respective campuses. In some instances this proved to be their institution's Alma Mater, in others a marching song, and in still others a college cheer. The Sisters of the Delta won the applause of all as they joined the Delta men in singing the words on the title page of Psi Upsilon's official songbook, a Delta tradition. But it was John H. Shevchuk, Zeta Zeta '80 who brought down the house with his one-man presentation of "Spiders and Snakes."

Becoming more serious, the audience

gave its full attention to Harry Holiday, Jr., Phi '45, the principal speaker of the evening. In an outstanding and hard-hitting address entitled "Are You Ever Going to Amount to Something?," the President of Armco Steel Corporation exhorted the undergraduates present to consider business for their career. Only the business system—companies, corporations, partnerships and entrepreneurs—he claimed, could be expected to make any real headway in filling human needs and solving the world's problems in this century. A condensed version of his remarks appears elsewhere in this issue.

Finally, great credit must be given Robert W. Morey, Pi '20, President of the Executive Council. As the presiding officer of the Convention, he set the tone of warmth and friendliness which epitomizes the feeling of brotherhood so characteristic of Psi Upsilon. And honors, too, should be heaped on J. Russell McShane, Delta '32, President of the Delta Corporation and Honorary Chairman of the 134th Convention, together with the Editor of THE DIAMOND. Behind every planning meeting and behind every event and function of the four-day splendor was his wise counsel and steady hand.

Home of "The Raven"

The Delta of Psi Upsilon and the City of Philadelphia are at odds regarding the birthplace of Edgar Allan Poe's *The Raven*. A federal grant of \$469,000 recently was approved for renovating a Philadelphia row house where it is claimed that the author, generally credited with perfecting the short story form of writing, lived from 1842 to 1844 and composed the immortal poem.

But scholars who have researched historic Greenwich Village, the center of New York City's artistic and literary activities, attest to *The Raven* having been completed in the building now owned by New York University and leased to the Delta Chapter. Its first reading is reported to have taken place at a literary soiree in the Waverly Place home of a Miss Wild, one of Poe's benefactors. The Delta Alumni Association has applied for the designation of the Chapter House as a National Historic Landmark. In light of the considerable funds already expended both by the University and the Delta in renovating 85 West 3rd Street, the Government could preserve Psi Upsilon's claimed site of Edgar Allan Poe's greatest writing at an appreciable saving!

THETA 1833

Although the Theta is small in numbers this year, a revived spirit of unity and purpose has strengthened the undergraduate brotherhood. With thirteen Brothers studying abroad or following other interests, there remain but eighteen actives to carry on.

As of this writing, the Theta is looking forward to a successful rush under the able leadership of Brother David Finnigan '80.

The physical condition of the House is comparatively good, as the Brothers worked hard to get things in order before classes began.

Our financial situation, although not envious, is improving. The dedication and hard work of the Chapter Trustees has enabled the Theta to begin slowly to move out of debt. New projects this year include publishing a newsletter, which hopefully will encourage greater alumni interest.

Brother Paul Matz '79 has won our esteem by being chosen a Nott Scholar. Psi U's continue to be active in intramurals, as well as in varsity sports. 1976-77 Annual Giving Results Best Yet; Record Breaker Seen as Pointing Trend

The remarkable response of Psi Upsilon alumni to the Fraternity's annual appeal for financial support in recent years has been the key factor in keeping undergraduate dues and membership fees among the lowest of all fraternities. Annual Giving now finances more than one-half of the Executive Council's operating expenses.

In 1976-77 contributions totaling \$54,196 were received, topping the previous year's record high by \$4,000. A significant feature of this continuing gain was the growing number of alumni who accepted leadership responsibility, an increase from 259 to 335 Brothers. In all 1,774 alumni gave an average of \$30.55 between July, 1976 and June, 1977, up from \$27.78 the preceding year, with equally welcome donations ranging from \$5 to \$1,000.

This represents a participation of 11.4 percent of the alumni

last year, and it is in this area that the greatest potential for further gains exists. We are advised that an average gift of \$2.50 per alumnus with good address is considered excellent. Psi Upsilon's average of \$3.49 in 1976-77 is believed to have been the highest in the fraternity world.

Years of consecutive giving are shown in parentheses after the name and class of donors in the acknowledgment lists which follow. Names in italics are leadership contributors. Tables of relative achievement by Chapter will appear in the next issue.

The Executive Council is deeply and profoundly grateful for the loyal and generous backing of Psi Upsilon alumni. The need is never-ending, of course, and in fact increases each year as costs continue to escalate. Hence even greater heights must be attained in 1977-78.

All-Inclusive Alumni Directory Underway

The Executive Council has responded to numerous inquiries by authorizing the preparation of an updated directory of all living alumni of Psi Upsilon. Scheduled for publication in December, this eighteenth edition will be the first directory printed since 1955, nearly a quarter of a century ago.

The Bernard C. Harris Publishing Company, Inc. of New York has been selected as the official publisher after a thorough review of this firm's extensive experience and success. Recognized as the oldest and largest exclusive publisher of alumni directories in the world, Harris Publishing has completed over the past thirty years more than 200 alumni directories for colleges, universities, secondary schools, and fraternal organizations.

This extensive project will be undertaken at virtually no cost to the Fraternity. Harris Publishing has contracted to compile, publish, and market the directory for our more than 17,000 alumni, financing the operation solely through the sale of individual directory copies. Nor will Psi Upsilon benefit financially from the directory sales; purchases should not be considered as a contribution. But the Fraternity will derive substantial benefit from the updated addresses and other valuable information obtained.

The main body of the directory will consist of an alphabetical listing of all alumni, with each entry to include name, chapter, class, college or university, home address and telephone, and busi-

ness or professional information, including address and telephone. Two complete indexes of all alumni, one arranged geographically by towns within states and the other alphabetically within each Chapter, will follow the main listings, providing ready references.

This updated material will be derived from brief questionnaires to be mailed from the Fraternity Office in April and May to all alumni with known addresses. Since the completeness and accuracy of the directory coverage depends upon the response of the alumni, all are urged to fill out the questionnaire carefully and legibly, returning it to Psi Upsilon at their earliest convenience.

During the months of July and August, once this data has been compiled, all alumni will be contacted by telephone for verification of the information to be printed in the directory. At that time, and at that time only, they will be invited to purchase a hard-bound or soft-bound copy. The Bernard C. Harris Company will publish only enough directories to fill these pre-publication orders, and no one except alumni will be permitted to purchase copies.

The Executive Council urges the full cooperation of Psi Upsilon's entire membership, in the firm conviction that this undertaking constitutes a significant service and an important milestone. Any alumni who fail to receive the questionnaire by the end of May are asked to contact the Fraternity Office, Two Station Square, Paoli, Pennsylvania 19301.
