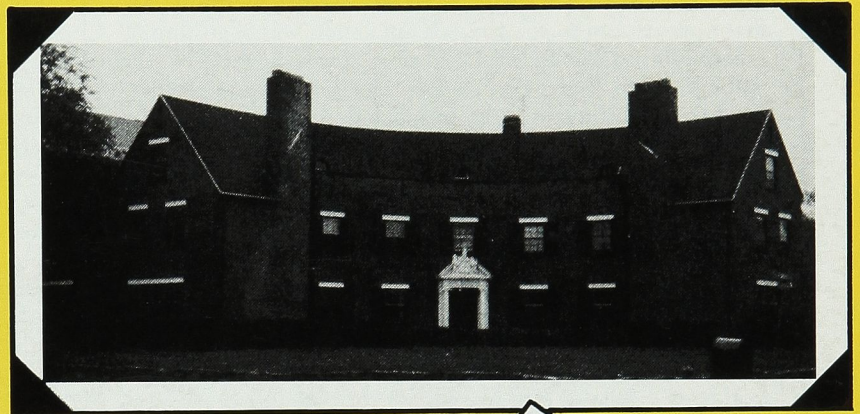
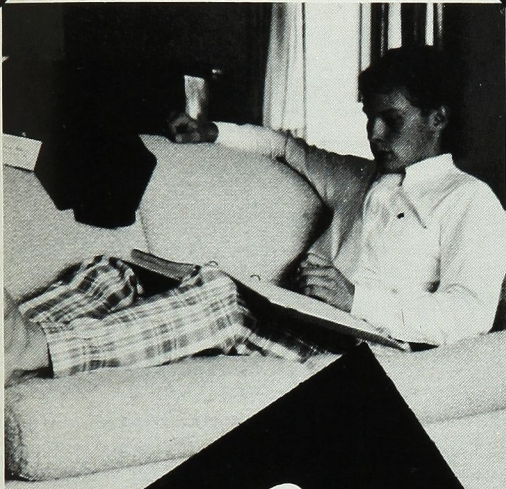

From An Owl

Psi U has never been larger or stronger — thirty-three active Chapters (including Owl Clubs) and more undergraduate members than at any previous time in our history! What could be a more appropriate time for our Fraternity to become more involved and interested in the affairs of other fraternities.

One aspect of Psi U's involvement in the interfraternity movement is our membership in the National Interfraternity Conference. Our attachments go back a long way in NIC — all the way back to the late thirties when Scott Turner, our own past President, was the President of NIC. His own distress upon Psi U's departure from NIC in the mid-part of this century did not deter Psi U from re-entering NIC in the 1970's and the active involvement of Brother Poor and Brothers Morey and McShane since that time. My first opportunity to see the NIC in action was at its annual meeting in Louisville last December. I was delighted at the willingness to share experiences and information that existed there and made many friendships that merely extend the group of "brothers" to whom we may all turn for assistance.

My experience was so encouraging that I was able to persuade the Executive Council to hold its meeting this December in Washington in conjunction with the annual meeting of NIC on December 5-7, 1985, at the Hyatt Regency Crystal City near Washington National Airport. This effort to participate with other fraternity volunteers and executives was a superb opportunity for our own volunteer leaders to exchange information with other fraternity leaders and gain new ideas in ways to deal with "the same old problems."

Our interfraternity efforts are not limited to the annual meeting of the National Interfraternity Conference, you can be sure. Brother Poor is an active member of the Fraternity Executives Association, having served as its President in recent years and the current chairman of a task force to plan for rather than react to circumstances similar to those that have occurred at Amherst College and Colby College in recent years. In addition, Brother Poor has been asked in recent years to assist in visits to various college and university campuses for the purpose of reviewing the fraternity systems and making recommendations to the administration and interfraternity councils for improvements.

Our field directors have regularly attended National Field Staff Conferences sponsored by the NIC to orient new fraternity field men to their jobs. That training, combined with a unique opportunity to have our field directors trained by the staff of Lambda Chi Alpha, has given them a rare insight into how other fraternities operate and how that can best be utilized by Psi U in its ongoing operations.

In addition to these disparate activities, Brother Poor and I have also had several unique opportunities to participate in planning for the future of the fraternity movement. He has participated for the last several years in several seminars designed to look at new approaches to the fraternity experience, not only from the specific fraternity viewpoint but also from the university and business viewpoint as well. I had a recent opportunity to participate in a conference sponsored by NIC to assist in the long range planning for that organization. Bringing together national fraternity and sorority presidents and executives as well as fraternity advisers, student affairs deans and vice presidents, and finally



college and university presidents themselves to plan for the future of the fraternity movement is quite an exciting experience. Breaking down into small groups carefully crafted to include members of all groups represented, we prognosticated about the next twenty-five years, looked at what the challenges and successes will be, and tried to identify appropriate organizational mechanisms to best meet those challenges. Those of you who have participated in corporate or governmental long range planning processes will understand both the enjoyment and the frustration of attempting to "crystal ball" the future while still trying to keep your feet planted firmly in the present. It is certainly a mind-expanding experience, and one that may prove helpful to Psi U as well.

Our interfraternity involvement is not limited to events involving many fraternities and multiple groups of concerned parties. We have also been working closer to home to reactivate an old interfraternity association — the Historical Triad. This group of three fraternities — Psi Upsilon, Alpha Delta Phi, and Delta Kappa Epsilon — holds a long historical thread! We have attempted to rekindle this old association with two meetings in the spring and summer of this year to share common challenges and experiences ranging from education programs to foundations to annual giving and see where our common interests might lead us.

In short, Psi U has always been involved in interfraternity efforts, whether it be encouraging the continuing involvement of our undergraduate Chapters in the interfraternity council on their campus, working with a few national fraternities with whom we share a special heritage, or making some small contribution (and taking away a wealth of experience and information) within the National Interfraternity Conference or the Fraternity Executives Association. Our efforts will continue and, we hope, will reap great new opportunities for Psi U to face the future better armed than we have been in the past.

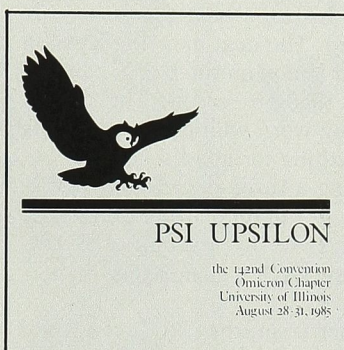
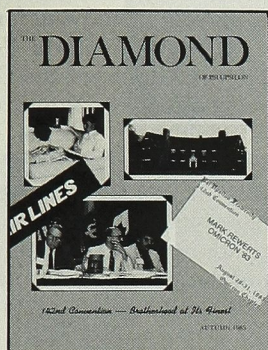

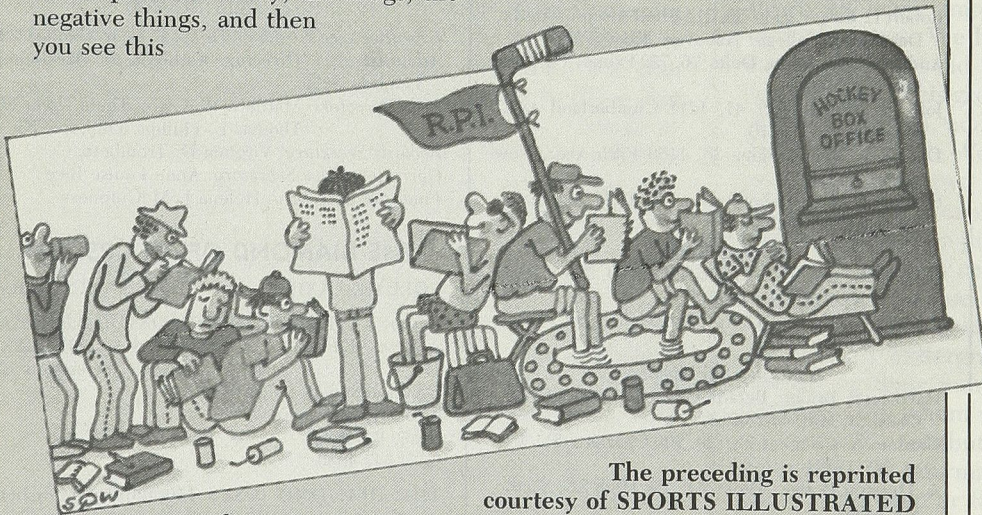
HOLD THAT LINE

(Troy, NY) On March 30, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute beat Providence 2-1 in Detroit to win the NCAA hockey championship. The next morning Epsilon Iota undergraduates showed up outside the Student Union on the R. P. I. campus and formed a line to buy season tickets for the 1985-86 season. The tickets weren't to go on sale until September 25, but they were willing to take turns waiting the 179 days for the window to open. Anything for good seats.

The Epsilon Iota undergraduates were upholding a three-decade-old R. P. I. tradition of student groups trying to outdo one another in line-sitting for hockey tickets. The previous long-wait record was 33 days, set by a group of ROTC students in 1983; but now, with the Engineers the NCAA champions, tickets obviously were *REALLY* worth waiting for.

The Psi U effort took stamina. During the summer term, they studied as they sat in a wading pool brought to the scene. They also hooked up a stereo system, for where would college students be without their rock 'n' roll? As September neared, other students joined the Psi U contingent on the line.

Their efforts did not go unnoticed. They were served coffee and doughnuts by Daniel Berg, President of R. P. I., and by the entire championship hockey team. Rensselaer's hockey coach watched and called the phenomenon of the hockey line "a great thing, wholesome and constructive. It's an outlet, a release for students in a very sophisticated academic environment. When you think of all the problems today, the drugs, the negative things, and then you see this

wholesome spirit, this esprit de corps, well it's gratifying."

IT'S A SMALL WORLD

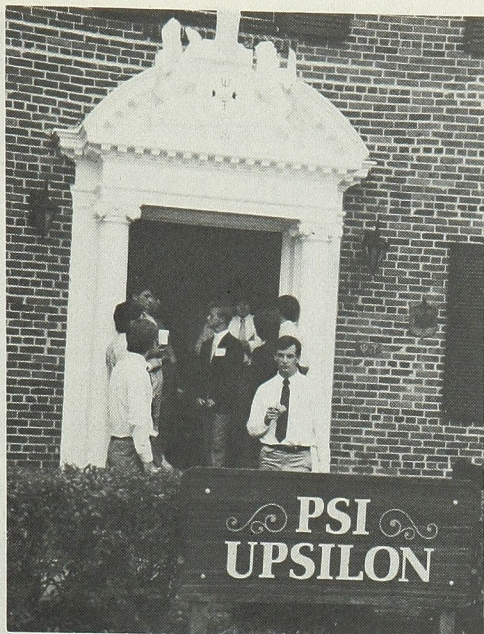

- Adoption of the "Fraternity Education" program, designed to meet the educational needs of both brothers and pledges. This replaces the "Pledge Education" program.
- Adoption of a Constitutional amendment which makes payment of membership fees a requirement for recognition as a member of the Fraternity.
- Selection of the Delta Chapter at New York University as the host of the 144th Convention in 1987 on the occasion of its 150th anniversary (the Theta Theta Chapter at the University of Washington already was chosen to host the 143rd Convention in 1986).

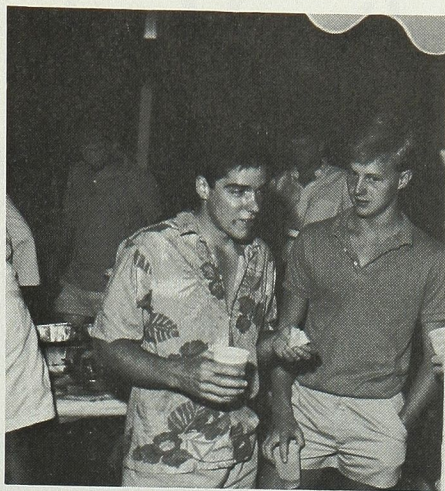
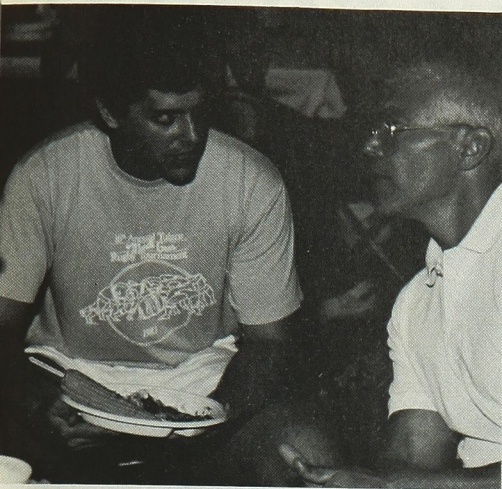
Before departing for one last open house at the Omicron, the group linked hands, formed a huge circle, and sang the "Shrine Song." It was a fitting end to a most memorable four days.

Many well-deserved kudos are in order for the brothers who made the 142nd

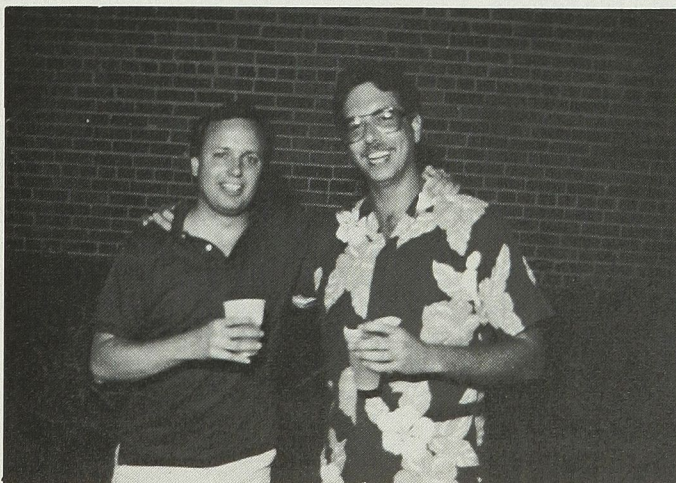
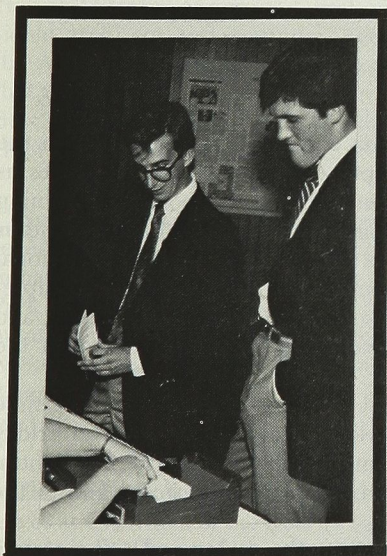
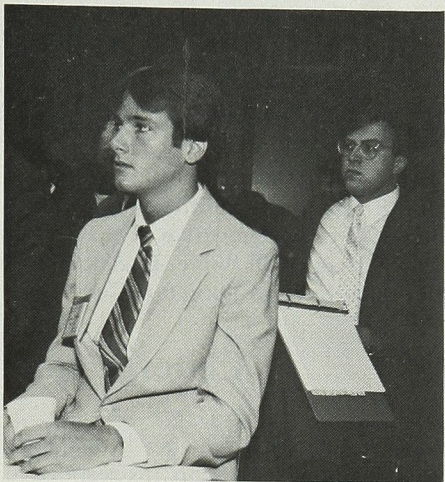
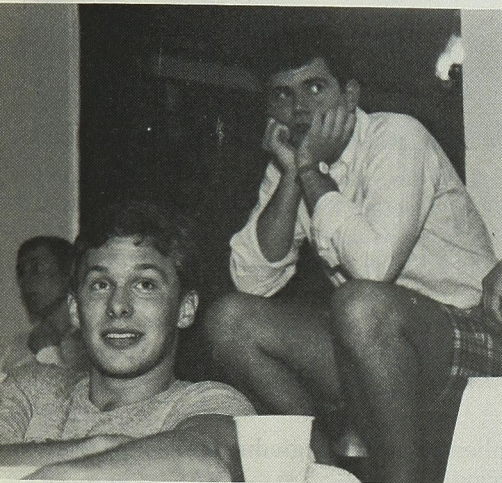

Governing Bodies Meet

Executive Council

The annual meeting of the Executive Council was held on October 4 at the General Warren Inne in Malvern, Pennsylvania. Preceding the meeting, members of the Fraternity's administrative body met at the Psi Upsilon office in nearby Paoli and had an opportunity to tour the facilities and visit with the staff. Among the topics discussed and action taken at this meeting were the following:

- Election of officers:

- Adoption of by-laws revisions to more accurately reflect the present size of the Executive Council, its election procedures, and its committee structure.
- Appointment of regular and special committees, including a Task Force on Ritual and a Sesquicentennial History Committee.
- Approval of two-month financial statement showing receipts of \$6,791.45 and expenses of \$34,319.53, for a deficit of \$27,528.08.
- Report of outstanding Chapter assessments in the amount of \$26,063.
- Approval of an interim policy to reimburse the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Undergraduate Advisory Board for their travel costs to Executive Council meetings at a rate no more than the least expensive airfare or their actual expense, whichever is less, with this policy to be reviewed by the Administrative Committee.
- Rho Chapter placed on "Review" status in light of its continuing problems, with minimum guidelines to be met by the end of this academic year.

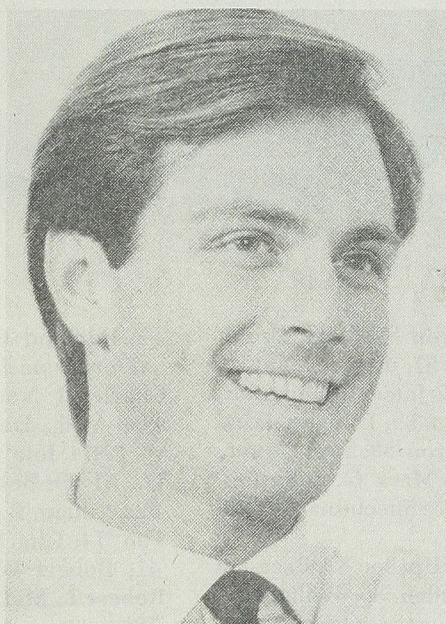
Brother Hutchison graduated from the University of California at Berkeley with

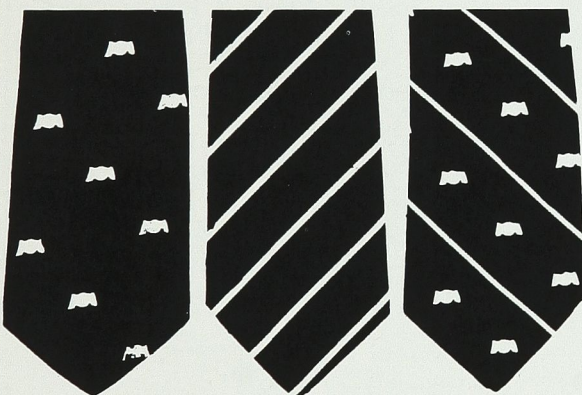
