




Michael Bay Directs Pearl Harbor **Epic**

n a sleepy Sunday morning in December, as children played and families prayed, squadrons of Japanese warplanes screamed across the skies of Hawaiian paradise and launched a surprise attack on the United States' armed forces at Pearl Harbor. The infamous day that jolted America from peaceful isolationism to total war is depicted in the new film, Pearl Harbor, directed by Michael Bay, Xi '86 (Wesleyan University).


Opening on the Memorial Day 2001 weekend, Pearl Harbor, with a production budget of \$135 million, is expected to be one of the most accurate World War II movies of its time. The blockbuster focuses on the lifechanging events surrounding December 7, 1941 and the war's devastating impact on two daring young pilots played by Ben Affleck and Josh Harnett and a dedicated nurse portrayed by Kate Beckinsale. It is a tale of catastrophic defeat, heroic victory, personal courage and overwhelming love set against a stunning backdrop of spectacular wartime action. Described as a cross between Saving Private Ryan and Titanic, the action in Pearl Harbor includes not only the devastating surprise attack by the Japanese but also the bombing of Tokyo by Jimmy Doolittle and his crew five months later.

Author and newscaster Tom Brokaw observed in The New York Times that World War II has been the subject of many epic motion pictures such as Battleground, The Battle of Britain, and Patton, but "it wasn't until recently that Hollywood began to treat the chaos, violence and random nature of combat in unsparing detail. The determination of a new generation of directors and technology are taking cinematic combat to new, utterly realistic levels."


Like Steven Spielberg's Saving Private Ryan, Michael Bay captures acts of individual heroism in Pearl Harbor. Unlike any other WWII film, Bay also seeks to capture the great loss of national innocence caused by the attack.

Pearl Harbor will delight fans of the striking pyrotechnics and extreme action scenes that have been widely praised in Bay's previous films. The task of coordinating extensive sets, massive crews and special effects used in the film is a daunting but natural progression for Bay's work. Last year during filming Bay told The New York Times, "We had 14 planes, 400 extras, bombs going off, everything timed. The Navy gave us so much stuff. We blew up over 10 600-foot ships. We did the largest film explosion I've ever seen. It took months to rig it and we had to make the world's largest gimbals - a whole front of a battleship flips over. Do you know how scary it is for a director to have 300 guys in the water, to have 80 stuntmen on 350,000 pounds of steel that goes upside down?"

Bay is known for carefully studying the reaction of his "target audience" at screenings and cutting his films accordingly. "If you're given \$135 million to make a film, you better know who your target audi-

ence is," Bay told USA Today. He moves quickly and shoots four times the average amount of film in a day. While some critics dismiss his style as sensory overload, he is also widely praised for his sheer brilliance. Bay is not modest about his desire to please studio execs and his reputation for not going over budget is part of the appeal. "I know I'm going to go out there and make them money," he told USA Today. "When I make them money, I'm going to get power and I'm going to get my way in terms of doing things where I can branch out."

It took more than Hollywood's money to get Pearl Harbor made; ultimately it took the cooperation of the Pentagon and Secretary of Defense, William H. Cohen, Kappa '62 (Bowdoin College). Without the Pentagon's cooperation, there would have been no movie. Using a two-minute animation depicting the armor-piercing bomb that lifted the USS Arizona nine feet out of the water, Bay assured the military of his commitment to historical accuracy.

Filming at Pearl Harbor, where bullet strafing marks on the walls and floors are preserved, involved men and women currently stationed there and, in some cases, their children. Naval and army historians lent

their support to ensure historical accuracy.

Pearl Harbor is also the work of Jerry Bruckheimer, who produced Bay's films Armageddon, The Rock, and Bad Boys, as well as screenwriter Randall Wallace (Braveheart, The Man in the Iron Mask). Bay met Bruckheimer while shooting a video for Days of Thunder and was offered Bad Boys, a stylish action comedy that grossed more than \$160 million worldwide. The 1995 film starred Will Smith and Martin Lawrence

Released on July 1, 1998, Armageddon is the eighth highest grossing movie to date and made Bay the youngest director to reach the billion-dollar box office mark worldwide. His involvement in the film extended into co-producing, casting, directing, and even shooting camera some days. Much of the film's humor was improvised. Bay even has a cameo role as a NASA engineer and is credited with the film's funniest line, "We don't wanna pay taxes. Ever."

Roger Ebert calls The Rock "a first-rate, slam-bang action thriller with a literate, witty screenplay and skilled craftsmanship in the direction and special effects." Starring Academy Award-winning actors, Sean Connery and Nicolas Cage, The Rock has just been released in a new DVD edition by Buena Vista Entertainment as part of its Criterion Collection. The new DVD includes audio commentary by Bay.

When Bruckheimer offered Bay the film, there was no script. "It's a trend in Hollywood," Bay says in the audio commentary to The Rock. "Films are greenlighted before there's a fully developed script." The trend continued as Pearl Harbor evolved. "It was greenlit, then ungreenlit, then greenlit again, meaning I had to hire, fire, then rehire the whole crew. The whole film had a recipe for disaster, with so many locations," Bay told Variety.

The recipe for disaster translates to a recipe for success for Bay, who made his first feature at the age of 13; creating a fiery enemy spaceship attack on his

train set and filming it with his mom's Super 8 camera. When the flames got out of control the fire department arrived to put out the firecracker-induced blaze.

As a teenager Bay worked for Lucasfilm, where a well-connected neighbor arranged a filing job. There he had the opportunity to watch Steven Spielberg create some of the greatest technical effects, stunts, and action sequences ever filmed. Spielberg's work on Raiders of the Lost Ark led an entire decade into big budget action/adventure movies. At the same time Bay began winning photography awards at Crossroads High School in Santa Monica and then headed off to Wesleyan University for film school.

His senior thesis, a short film called Benjamin's Birthday won the school's prestigious Frank Capra Award. "That's when I discovered that I really liked making an audience laugh," Bay told USA Today. "I saw 350 people staring at the screen, laughing. I thought that was pretty cool."

Bay returned to Los Angeles and studied at Pasadena's exclusive Art Center College of Design where a student project caught the attention of Capitol Records. His ninety-second Coke commercial led to directing a surprise comeback video for Donny Osmond. He gained immediate hands-on shooting experience with Propaganda Films creating music videos for Tina Turner, Meatloaf, Lionel

Richie, Wilson Phillips and the

DiVinyls, earning Bay a number of MTV award nominations. His first move into television advertising, an ad for the American Red Cross, won a Clio. He was awarded the Grand Prix Clio for Commercial of the Year for his Got Milk/Aaron Burr commercial and also filmed advertisements for Nike, Reebok, Coca Cola, Budweiser, Miller Lite, and Mercedes. At the Cannes International Film Festival he won the Gold Lion for the Best Beer Campaign for Miller Lite, as well as the Silver Lion for Got Milk. In 1995, the Directors Guild of America honored Bay as Commercial Director of the year. Within the last decade Bay has won every major commercial direction award.

It remains to be seen whether Pearl Harbor will join such recent epics as Gladiator, Titanic, and Braveheart as an Academy Award winner and whether Michael Bay will become Psi Upsilon's eighth Academy Award nominee. Pearl Harbor, with its grand scale and intimate story line, might just fit the bill. •




The Sweetheart Song

After serving on the faculty and as director of the student counseling service at Northern Illinois University, he returned to Miami in 1961, joining the faculty as director of the student counseling service and professor of counseling and guidance. He retired in 1980. Brother Brown attended the University of Minnesota and earned a bachelor's degree from the University of New Hampshire, a master's degree from Columbia University and a doctorate from Boston University. He and his wife, Bonne, were Miami's Parents of the Year in 1998. His wife: three sons, Paul, David and Robert; a daughter Jeannie; a brother and a sister survive him.

Matthew V. Byrne Jr. Pi

'42, 80, of Manlius, NY and Nantucket, MA, died in October 2000. Born in Syracuse, he earned a bachelor's degree and a law degree from SU's College of Law. In 1957, he founded Byrne, Costello & Pickard, where he practiced law before his retirement in 1998. He was a founder of St. Camillus Health & Rehabilitation Center, the Mount St. James Corp. and the Madaket Land Trust and served as president of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Syracuse. He was a communicant of Immaculate Conception Church and a member of the New York State Bar Association, the Onondaga Council of the Boy Scouts of America and the Century Club. He also had articles published in Sports Illustrated, Gray's Sporting Journal and the Journal of the Nantucket Historical Association. His wife, Elvira; three sons, Michael, Matthew and Lawrence; two daughters, Melanie and Amy; two

brothers, C. Vincent and John; and 10 grandchildren survive him.

Chris G. Farrand, Phi '63 died on September 11, 2000. He is survived by his wife, Christa, sons Stephan and Alex, one grandchild, two brothers and many friends.

Ray Freeark, Omega '49, died on August 12, 2000 after a noble fight with Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma. Born in Chicago in 1925, he graduated from the University of Chicago high school and college, where he starred in varsity basketball and baseball. He was an active recruiter of new members for the chapter.

Brother Freeark joined the naval V-5 program in 1943 and served two years in the air corps during which time he was enrolled at both Duke University and the University of Georgia and competed in crosscountry. After his discharge from the Navy, he embarked upon a career in coaching and

teaching and attended Washington University Law School. He received his law degree in 1957. As founder and partner in the law firm of Freeark, Harvey, Mendillo, Dennis, Wuller, and Cain, Brother Freeark did extensive work for the members of the Illinois Medical Society. He was a member or the St. Clair County, Illinois State and American Bar Associations. In 1980, he was elected as fellow of the American College of Trial lawyers.

Brother Freeark enjoyed landscaping and horse racing. He edited and published the Illinois Thoroughbred magazine and many articles. In 1972, Gov. Dan Walker appointed him to the Illinois Racing Board. In 1975, he was selected as the Illinois Division HBA Man of the Year and in 1976, as the National HPBA Man of the year. His legal effort on behalf of breeders did much to establish and maintain the breeding industry in Illinois.

He was preceded in death by his parents and is survived by his wife, Arlene, two daughters and one son; seven grandchildren, two brothers and two nieces.

Robert W. Freund, Rho '63 died August 24, 2000 of throat cancer in Oak Park, IL. He is survived by his daughter, Amanda of Chicago and was predeceased by his wife Abigail.

Wesley S. Goode Jr. Rho '50 died peacefully at his residence in Crandon, WI on January 5, 2001 at the age of 76. Brother Goode was the founder and owner of Goode Business Systems, Inc. of Milwaukee from 1973 until retirement. He was predeceased by special friend Elizabeth Pfleger and is survived by his former wife, Mary Kalvelage; three daughters, Margaret, Virginia and Jane; two sons Thomas and Joseph; brothers Robert and John; sister Janet; six grandchildren and several other relatives.

W. Kaye Lamb, Zeta Zeta '27 died at the age of 95. He was the visionary founder of the National Library of Canada and a distinguished historian, archivist and author.

Brother Lamb was born in New Westminster, B.C. on May 11, 1904. He attended UBC and graduated in 1927 with first-class honors in history. On a Nichol Scholarship, he studied in France at the Sorbonne and the Ecole libre des sciences politiques. He completed a master's in history at UBC and finished his doctorate at the London School of Economics.

In 1936, he founded the British Columbia Historical Quarterly and by 1940, he was working as university librarian at UBC, a post he held until he went to the National Library in 1953.

In 1948, he made a presentation to the Prime Minister and argued that Canada was the only civilized nation without a national library. He was then appointed Dominion archivist and was responsible for forming a national library. He did so in only five years, drafting the National Library Act in 1952. In Ottawa, Brother McElfresh, Pi '44. Lamb supervised the installation of the first computerized library catalogue in Canada and pioneered the use of microphotography in the National Library's collection. He also proposed the building that now houses the library and the National Archives.

He retired from the National Library in 1968 and wrote four books of Canadian history, numerous articles and edition the journals of Captain George Vancouver and Alexander Mackenzie. His four-volume edition of Capt. Vancouver's explorations, published in 1984, includes a 256-page introduction that is considered to be the definitive biography of the explorer.

Brother Lamb was also a member and president of the Royal Society of Canada, an Officer of the Order of Canada and a member of the Society of Archivists (England) and the Society of American Archivists.

William Lamb married Wessie Tipping in 1939. They met in Paris, and later worked on many projects together, including the Encyclopedia Canadiana. Wessie Tipping died in 1981. They had one daughter, Elizabeth.

John E. McElfresh, Theta '42 died at the age of 82 at his home in Owensboro, KY. The Woodbury, NJ native was a graduate of Peddie School in Hightstown, NJ and Union College. He attended the University of Michigan were he was initiated into Psi Upsilon and was a pilot and captain in the Army Air Force during World War II. He retired as a manager of marketing from General Electric Co. in 1979. He Survivors include his wife of 51 years Dorothy; two daughters; three grandchildren; and a brother, Robert M.

George Reifenstein, Pi '32 died December 1, 1999 at his home in Auke Lake, AK after a long illness.

He was graduated with an AB Degree, cum laude. He received his M.D. degree, summa cum laude, from Syracuse University College of Medicine in 1936. He served as medical house officer at the Peter Bent Brigham Hospital in Boston, as a fellow in medicine at Harvard Medical School and as a graduate fellow in cardiology at Massachusetts General Hospital and University Hospital in Ann Arbor, MI.

He was certified by the American Boards of Pathology, Internal Medicine and Cardiovascular Diseases and authored more than 50 medical and scientific papers.

He taught for more than 30 years as a professor of pathology at Syracuse University College of Medicine and George Washington University, a professor of internal medicine at the State University of New York and a lecturer in medicine for the University of California in San Francisco.

Reifenstein was was in private practice in Syracuse with his father and brother. He joined the U.S. Naval Reserves in 1943 and was called to active duty in 1955 as chief of cardiology at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Oakland, CA. From 1958 to 1965 he was director of medical education at St. Mary's Hospital in San Francisco, then became technical director of

clinical research and the medical education for the U.S. Navy. He was promoted to Rear Admiral in 1966 and retired from civil service in 1974. He spent a year in Saudi Arabia as director of medical services at the Jeddah Military Hospital and then as a volunteer providing medical service in Kabul, Afghanistan.

Among his honors and affiliations were membership in Phi Beta Kappa, Alpha Omega Alpha, fellow at the American College of Cardiology in 1963, fellow at the American College of Physicians, Boy Scouts of America, Syracuse Medical Alumni Association, Knights of Columbus and founding member of the American Federation for Clinical Research.

He enjoyed fishing, traveling, ham radio, reading and researching Civil War history.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 49 years, Dorothy, son Peter, daughters Mary and Nancy and brother Edward Reifenstein, Pi '30. He is survived by his wife of 11 years Patricia, son George Jr, Reifenstein, Pi '72 several grandchildren, brother Dr. Robert W. Reifenstein, Pi '43 and numerous nieces, nephews and other family members. Internment took place at Arlington National Cemetery in April. ♦


